PA Business Week facts

- 187 Programs, November 1997 thru May 2022.
- Over 23,000 students
- 18 High Schools have hosted the program in 5 Western PA counties.
- Volunteer hours average 424 per program, bringing an estimate volunteer time commitment over the past 25 years to 79,288 volunteer hours.
- An average of 80 educators per year partner with volunteer business advisors in the classroom.

Pennsylvania Business Week is the first in-school program of its kind in the United States. Considered the pioneer in its field, business and educational organizations from numerous other states have implemented similar programs in their schools based on this model, created in Erie, PA.

Americans for the Competitive Enterprise System (ACES) is a non-profit, non-political, educational organization promoting the understanding of free market economics to students, teachers, and the general public through partnerships between the business and education communities. ACES has served communities in Western Pennsylvania since 1956.
