Pennsylvania Business Week

Pennsylvania Business Week is an economic education program of the Americans for the Competitive Enterprise System (ACES). It is a one-week in-school program with a challenging curriculum that teaches students about the American economic system. The students are divided into management teams that “run” their own company for the equivalent of 12 business quarters.

Types of Volunteerism:

Business Advisor

- *Time Commitment: 1 week (Mon. – Fri.) from start of school day – end of school day*
- *Roughly 30 - 40 hours*

The business advisor plays a key role in the success of Pennsylvania Business Week by interacting with and guiding a student company throughout the week. The business advisor is a volunteer who is willing and able to spend Monday through Friday from approximately 7:30 am until 3:00 pm (the entire school day) with a group of 10 – 15 high school students. Previous commitments such as appointments or meetings can be accommodated, as long as the advisor can be there the majority of the time.

Business advisors should either be currently involved in business in some aspect or retired from business. The students will directly benefit from the real-world business experiences that business advisors can provide and will share. You don't need to have a business degree or be an accountant! The ACES team is on-site and will present the information to the students. As an advisor, you are there to guide, mentor and encourage.

Business advisors are partnered with a teacher in the classroom and together they guide the students through the week, sharing experiences and culminating in competitions with a "Top Company" being named at the end of the week. The four competitions include: Return on Net Assets (RONA, this is the financial simulation), Advertising and Marketing, the Trade Show, and Stockholders.

Both teacher and volunteer advisors will be asked to attend a training session that will provide the advisors with the information that they will need to know during the program. This training session is usually held the Friday before the program, at the school.

Connecting with your local school in this way is a good opportunity to open up lines of communication between the business and education communities. You will also be able to network with other volunteer business advisors throughout the week. Most important is the satisfaction of helping students gain a better understanding of their future in the workforce, career exploration and personal growth.

Competition Judge

- *Time Commitment: Friday Morning or Late Friday Morning of each school's program week*
- *Roughly 3 -5 hours*

Competition Judges are volunteers that are able to dedicate roughly 4/5 hours on a Friday morning to judge one of the competitions presentations. These volunteers are experienced in accounting, advertising, banking, and related fields to set the standards in the student competitions.

The 3 areas for judging include:

1. **Advertising & Marketing:** Takes place Friday morning, from roughly 7:30 am – 11:30 am, and judges will score teams on their marketing strategy, ad campaign, and overall presentation.
2. **Stockholders Presentation:** Takes place Friday morning, from roughly 7:30 am – 11:30 am, and judges will score teams on their financial understanding of how they invested their money in our computer simulation to compete for orders. Teams will present income statements, balance sheets, charts, and graphs to best explain their financial decision making.
3. **Trade Show:** Takes place Friday late morning, from roughly 11:30 am – 1:00 pm. Judges will circle the gym (trade show) and score teams on their overall table display, prototype, and sales pitch.
